YOUR MISSION:

Research one of the 45 American Presidents, and create a video one minute or less that shares the information you discovered. You may want to...

- 1. Determine the years the President served in office (term/s)
- 2. Identify the political party that nominated the President
- 3. Discover major actions the President took in office
- 4. Were they re-elected/died/denied?
- 5. Find out what your President's personality was like
- 6.Add some things you learned about the President that are "stranger than fiction" or extraordinary in some way
- 7. Identify what the President is most remembered for now (legacy)

FUNDAMENTALS

Video includes some of the 'basics' about the president portrayed, in order to provide general context.



ACCURATE HISTORICAL CONTENT

No fake news! Information presented must come from factual, history based sources. Must include and cite at least one primary source, by mentioning the source or using a citation format.



STRONG VISUALS

Overall visual presentation demonstrates effort to share content in a compelling way.



CREATIVITY


Video uses creativity in storytelling, impersonation, original art, humor, or makes use of other methods.

Why does the president's life "go on?" Video content speaks to this question in some way.
